Adopt-A-Thons

PACC911 focuses on providing venues for large joint adoption functions. These well attended events create an ideal opportunity for the animal welfare groups to gain exposure for their organizations and the services they provide, while offering the animals needing to be re-homed a new chance to be seen. These venues also enable the groups the opportunity to educate the unknowing public about key issues, such as the need to spay and neuter pets as a means of reducing pet euthanasia.

Fundraising

PACC911's Bowl-A-Rama for Animal Rescue has proven to be a fantastic and much needed fundraiser for the animal community. This one-of-a-kind event, conceived by board member Eileen Proctor, allows the individual groups with limited resources a chance to raise big bucks at no cost to them. All money collected by each group remains with that group.

At the same time, PACC911 solicits for sponsorships for the event, thus supporting our Emergency Medical Fund. Since its inception over \$600,000 has been raised to help the animals of our community. Bowl-A-Rama is a much needed fundraiser for the rescue community, but also an opportunity to raise awareness for important animal issues. PACC911 is committed to continuing this high-energy event on the first Saturday of August for years to come! In fact, the first Saturday of August is officially Bowl-A-Rama for Animal Rescue Day, as proclaimed by the Governor of Arizona, and the Mayors of Phoenix, Paradise Valley and Scottsdale.

Before you call, note the time your pet was exposed to the toxin, the type of product ingested, the manufacturer's name and any ingredients you can find listed on packaging.

If you need to speak to a veterinarian, this service will be billed to a credit card. An alternate number is (900) 680-0000. Veterinarian services on this line will cost a flat fee (billed to your phone bill) for the first five minutes, and an additional fee per minute for each additional minute.

FOR LOST & FOUND PETS



Distribute flyers all over the area that the pet was lost or found. Photos on flyers if possible. Distribute flyers to schools, shopping centers, pet stores, animal clinics, vets, emergency animal clinics. Inform mail carriers, meter readers, delivery drivers and school children.

Most papers offer free ads for lost & found
Weekend ads work best
If a FOUND animal is not claimed, work with a rescue group to help place it into a loving home
NEVER offer "free to a good home"

Once you find your lost pet, microchip or tattoo them ASAP to prevent this from happening again.
